Spanish Language Immersion program in Madrid, Spain (Group Course A)

**2 units of UCSD Extension credit in Spanish
language per week**

Cost to apply for credit: \$55/unit

Studying at =Elemadrid= brings you closer to speaking Spanish and understanding the Spanish culture. =Elemadrid= is a leading private Spanish language school in Madrid, and has focused its curricular design to adult learners. Students who have completed course A are eligible for UCSD Extension credit on a pass/no pass basis. Academic credit is not available for private instruction.

Upon arrival to =Elemadrid=, each student's proficiency level is evaluated through a written exam and oral interview. Based on the results, students are assigned to one of five course levels. Classroom instruction is conducted entirely in Spanish and emphasizes oral expression, vocabulary development, grammatical accuracy, listening comprehension and linguistic and socio-cultural proficiency. Class size is limited to seven students, and instructors are encouraged and trained to develop their students' active speaking skills. Course content is designed to integrate how Spanish is used in Spain as well as in other Spanish-speaking countries.

In addition to daily classroom instruction, =Elemadrid= offers an optional Practice Immersion program, which was conceived to enhance a student's learning of Spanish language and culture through a series of didactic activities outside of the classroom and with local Madrileños. Through conferences and interviews, students can talk and listen to Madrileños and learn from their experiences. What type of credit does UCSD Extension award?

UCSD Extension credit is not the same as UCSD credit. Because UCSD Extension is not a degree-granting institution, your college or employer must decide how units earned through UCSD Extension will transfer. All courses are in the 40000 level, which meets requirements for professional-level certificate programs or provide opportunities for professional or career advancement. These courses also provide opportunities for the general public to enhance their knowledge in various academic fields. UCSD Extension operates on the quarter system. To compute the semester equivalent, use the following equation: 1 UCSD Extension unit = 2/3 semester unit.

Who is eligible to receive UCSD Extension credit?

UCSD Extension credit is available to anyone who has successfully completed Group Program A for programs lasting two to twelve weeks. There are no in-state California residency requirements. Special variations of these two programs do not qualify, and partial credit is not permitted.

When should I apply for the credit?

You should apply after your requested program dates have been confirmed with =Elemadrid= in Madrid. While we prefer to receive the application before you leave for Spain, we can accept an application for academic credit up to two weeks after the end of your academic program at =Elemadrid=. Only programs completed after March 12, 2007 are eligible receive UCSD Extension academic credit.

How do I apply for UCSD Extension academic credit?

1. Present this packet of information to your college or university or employer for review. Before leaving for Madrid, you should confirm, in writing, what you will need to do to successfully apply the units earned.
2. Complete and mail the application and necessary fees to Travel Study Programs, UCSD Extension, 9500 Gilman Dr., 0170-A, La Jolla, CA 92093-0170 after you have confirmed your enrollment with =Elemadrid=. You must still enroll in the program directly through =Elemadrid=. UCSD Extension will not do that for you.
3. If you haven't attended the program yet, UCSD Extension will notify =Elemadrid= of your intent to take the course for academic credit. If you have already attended =Elemadrid= and it is within two weeks since your program ended, we will confirm your enrollment, language level, attendance and academic performance with the school.
4. Once your academic performance can be evaluated, you will be granted 2 units of UCSD Extension credit per week. Official notification will be sent by email, and grades can be verified through UCSD Extension's online student portal, ExtensionLink.
