Our Extension leadership and university officials are implementing mandates and recommendations from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC), the California Department of Public Health and San Diego County Public Health to ensure your ongoing safety and for all populations at UC San Diego.

Mandatory online or remote instruction will be in effect for all Extension courses through spring quarter. If you are taking a course that is not fully online please contact your Program Manager to discuss your options to continue your studies or pursuit of a certificate uninterrupted.

The following actions will be taken for Spring Quarter 2020.

Enrollment and Instruction

- Mandatory online or remote instruction will affect all Extension courses through spring.
- There will be no changes for students enrolled in online courses.
- In-person classes will shift to a remote learning format.
 - Remote classes will be held at the scheduled class time.
 - Lectures or discussions will take place via a remote web conferencing format.
 - Accommodations and instructions will be provided by your instructor.
